

A Message to the Staff from Dr. Gregg Okesson, Provost of Asbury Seminary

Kenyan theologian, John Mbiti, is famous for describing African communal identity through the phrase: "I am because we are; and because we are, I am." This saying captures quite a bit of truth for the ways that individuals are shaped by community, and communities shaped by individuals.

In America, we place extraordinary focus on the individual: their gifts, education, or anything we deem spectacular. We love our heroes! What I like about Mbiti's quote is that he doesn't neglect the person. The individual is not swallowed up by the community. Rather, the individual and community interrelate with each other in a dynamic dance.

Christian community is like that. You can read about it in those biblical passages that talk about spiritual gifts (Rom. 12, 1 Cor. 12, Eph. 4). The Holy Spirit is the one who brings the individuals into a new form of community; then the community, by the Spirit, forms each of us as persons.

Asbury Theological Seminary is a "Community Called"! There are no solitary heroes here. We are only as strong as each one of us doing his or her service, through the Holy Spirit. And here's the tremendous thing: we will be together for all eternity!

We have one another only through Christ, but through Christ we do have one another, wholly, for eternity. p. 14.

During this "Year of the Staff," we thank you for your tireless service. And even more importantly, we celebrate the ways you are growing us into the fullness of Jesus Christ.
