A Message to the Staff from Rev. Jessica LaGrone, Dean of Chapel

I didn't start out looking towards ministry as a career. My first calling was in medicine. I worked in hospitals and doctor's offices in my late teens and early twenties.

With my limited credentials, I was mostly qualified to be that person who calls you in from the waiting room, takes your temperature and blood pressure, and asks you questions about your medical history. The technical word (medicine has so many of them!) for the medical history is the word anamnesis: the story of the body.

Let me tell you that this is holy work. When someone is recounting for you what they've been through - both hurt and healing - you feel a bit like a priest receiving something holy and sacred in that person's story. You're responsible for listening well and asking good questions: How long has the body felt this way? How did it get to this point? When you write down an anamnesis you are passing along information that will help a doctor or nurse determine not only what has passed, but what the next steps are for this particular body to have a healthy and whole future.

Imagine my surprise when I left medicine for ministry and discovered that ministry also used the word "anamnesis!" During Communion, anamnesis is the point where the pastor or priest tells the story of what Jesus has done for us. It tells the story of his life, miracles, ministry, death, resurrection, ascension, and return.

A Message to the Staff from Rev. Jessica LaGrone, Dean of Chapel (cont.)

This is a different kind of a story of the body. A history of the body of Christ, being retold even as we are about to receive the body and blood in Communion.

During this Centennial year at Asbury, we are doing something a little like an anamnesis: telling the story of the body in lots of different ways. We're celebrating what the Body of Christ gathered at Asbury over the last 100 years has experienced and achieved. I love that we get to be part of Asbury's body present here for the 100th year celebration. What a privilege!

It's so clear to me that the story of the body that is Asbury could not happen without the gathered Body of Christ that is Asbury's staff. I see you daily going about the business of making Asbury a place of blessing to others. In so many ways, both visible and invisible to others, you serve God in your role by serving others. I can't even take a few steps at Asbury without experiencing some blessing a staff member has contributed!

I'm grateful we have a chance to remember that we're part of a larger story here. But I'm equally grateful to you for the work you're doing that is already building the next 100 years. I love being part of the Body of Christ at Asbury with you!

I Corinthians 12:12-14

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.



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
